FROM PAGE TO STAGE OLIVER'S PROGRESS

For a musical about child labor, domestic abuse, funerals, murder and criminality of all types, and lyrics referencing cockroaches, rats, public hangings, and the Plague, *Oliver!* is a surprisingly delightful evening in the theatre. If it sounds grim to you, just be glad it doesn't hew closer to its roots: Charles Dickens' second novel *Oliver Twist*, or the *Parish Boy's Progress*.

Though he wasn't the first English novelist, Dickens was inarguably the superstar practitioner of the form. *Oliver Twist* originally appeared as a serial in *Bentley's Miscellany*, a popular magazine of the time, and readers waited breathlessly for new installments of what was riveting, if gritty, subject matter. The ill-treatment of children in Victorian London was a subject which hit close to home for the author, as Dickens himself was sent at a young age to work in a shoe polish factory, working long hours for low pay.

Along with Oliver, the Artful Dodger, Nancy, and Bill Sikes, the novel's most memorable character is probably the elderly fence Fagin, who was, and remains, controversial as a clearly anti-Semitic creation. Much sanitized for the musical, the Fagin of the novel is carefully crafted to resemble Satan, actively plots to destroy Oliver with a character called Monks (completely discarded in the musical), and even lies to Sikes that Nancy has betrayed him, effectively sealing her fate.

So, who thought all of this would be enchanting subject matter for a musical? Lionel Bart wrote *Oliver!* in 1960 at 30 years old, and it made him a star, rubbing elbows with phenoms like John Lennon, and even leading to an alleged affair with a then unknown David Bowie. Andrew Lloyd Weber has called Bart the "Father of the modern British musical." Bart wrote the book, lyrics, and the music for the show, a feat which often involves several different writers. Though he would go on to write a number of hit songs for a variety of English singers (including the theme song for the Bond film "To Russia with Love") and another musical, *Fings Ain't Wot They Used T'Be*, nothing achieved the success of *Oliver!* which is still revived perennially in England, often to sold-out crowds. The 1968 film version won the Academy Award for Best Picture.

On the night of the Beatles' American premiere on *The Ed Sullivan Show* in 1964, watched by an estimated 73 million people, Georgia Brown as Nancy, and a young, pre-Monkees Davy Jones as The Artful Dodger, appeared on the same program, singing "I'd Do Anything" and "As Long as He Needs Me." This was certainly one of the first introductions to the show stateside, where it would continue its Broadway run for 774 performances. The vinyl record of the original Broadway cast found its way into many American homes (including mine; I still have it) reaching #20 on the Bill-board chart for mono LPs in 1963.

This season's production marks PCT's third presentation of *Oliver!* in its forty-year history. Oliver—the character, the book, and the musical—continue to be popular because at the heart of his story is a search for love and family. Strip away the grislier elements of the tale, and we are left with Oliver's poignant demand to know where love resides

While Fagin's Den of Thieves is no better a place for Oliver than the Workhouse he escapes from, we do get an extended, glorious glimpse into where Oliver will eventually land: Mayfair. In a giddy, hauntingly beautiful tribute to London life in all of its busy industry and joy, "Who Will Buy" shows us the London where Oliver is fated to find a family. Not his "real" parents, but those who will love him just as if he were their own. Progress indeed.



GLOSSARY OF BRITISH TERMS AND SLANG IN OLIVER!

GRUEL: A thinner, watery version of porridge, usually oats or some other type of cereal.

CADGE: To obtain something for free by persuasion or imposition.

PEASE PUDDING: Literally a pudding made of boiled peas and spices.

SAVELOYS: sausages

SIXPENCE: a silver coin worth six pennies.

SHILLING: Twelve pence

BOB: another term for a shilling, a coin worth 12 pence **TODDY:** A drink made with liquor, hot water and sugar.

ARTFUL DODGER: In Cockney rhyming slang, a two-word phrase stands in for a particular word which also rhymes with the second word of the phrase, such as "daisy roots" for "boots" or "trouble and strife" for "wife." Artful Dodger is cockney rhyming slang for "lodger."

TOFF: derogatory slang for a rich or upper-class person.

BEAK/MAGISTRATE: Beak is British slang for a magistrate, which is an officer of the law

"FLASH MATE": In British slang, flash means stylishly dressed. It is probable that the Dodger is being ironic when addressing Oliver as such.

"NOT ARF": Meaning "Not half," which is an abbreviation of "And that's not the half of it." Similar to saying "You bet," or "You got that right."

"PLUMMY AND SLAM": clearly a password used by Nancy, it is thought to have been coined by Dickens for the novel.

FLOUNCES: a strip of decorative material attached to a garment

FURBELOWS: a gathered strip or pleated border of a skirt or petticoat

TIMBUKTU: A city in the West African nation of Mali, used in slang to mean any distant and inaccessible location

BOW STREET RUNNERS: London's first professional police force

JEMMY: a short crowbar

"BLOWED UPON": to be made the subject of a scandal or otherwise discredited

CLARIDGE'S: A luxury hotel in London, located in the upper class district of Mayfair

WORKHOUSE: A British institution where those unable to support themselves financially were housed. Noah uses the phrase to describe Oliver as an obvious insult.
