



Dramaturg Note BY GREGORY BROWN

Roald Dahl and the (Very Dark) Chocolate Factory



In 1953, eleven years before he would create the characters of Charlie Bucket, Willy Wonka, Violet Beauregarde, Mike Teavee and others, British author Roald Dahl published a story about a woman who murders her cheating husband by hitting him in the head with a frozen leg of lamb. She then cooks the lamb while phoning the police to tell them she has found her husband dead on the kitchen floor after returning from shopping. While the detectives look for clues, the woman suggests they all must be getting hungry and invites them to

eat the lamb, thereby getting rid of the murder weapon forever. The story was titled "Lamb to the Slaughter."

In case anyone had any doubts about the author of Charlie and The Chocolate Factory's wicked sense of humor and love of the macabre, that story should serve as a clear indication of Dahl's worldview. In fact, Dahl penned as many horror stories and stories for adults as he did for children but is still famous mostly for the latter. It hasn't been lost on contemporary readers that his children's books are written from the point of view of someone who doesn't seem to particularly like children. Or makes certain there are no shortage of characters who don't like them. In Matilda, the character Agatha Trunchbull declares, "I have never been able to understand why small children are so disgusting. They're the bane of my life. They're like insects: they should be got rid of as early as possible."

Charlie and the Chocolate Factory has been controversial for its depiction of the Oompa Loompas, who were, in the original edition of the book, black "pygmies" who Wonka smuggled out of the "deepest and darkest part of the African jungle." In 1970, The NAACP expressed concern about this portrayal, especially in light of the upcoming Gene Wilder film. Dahl himself made the changes, re-imagining the Oompa Loompas in a subsequent edition as having "golden-brown hair" and "rosy, white skin."

(No word on how they got orange with green hair in the movie.) This edit doesn't change much regarding the way the Oompa Loompas are treated in the book, nor how they are regarded. At one point Grandpa Joe tells Charlie that they are "not people." Passages like this, coupled with Dahl's evident Anti-Semitism, is probably what led to a wide-ranging censorship and bowdlerization of the author's books, carried out by his own publishers, Puffin Books in England.



In 2023, in an article titled "Woke Willie Wonka," Forbes magazine reported that "classic children's books written by Roald Dahl, such as Charlie and the Chocolate Factory and Matilda, are being rewritten to remove potentially offensive language, a move which has offended readers across the internet." The article identifies changes to words, phrases, sentences, and even entire passages originally authored by Dahl, some seemingly arbitrary and slightly mystifying. For instance, Augustus Gloop is no longer called "fat." The offending word is removed and changed to "enormous." The ensuing description is unaltered except for the ban on the word "fat," now reading "a nine-year-old boy who was so enormous he looked like he had been blown up by a powerful pump." Along with: "great folds bulged out from every part of his body, and his face was like a ball of dough." Hey, at least no one said he was fat!

It is probably fair to say that more people now know the story of Charlie Bucket through films rather than the original novel even if, in the movies, the focus shifts from Charlie to the candymaker Wonka, whose name dominates the titles of two of the films, whittled down to the single name Wonka in its most current iteration. This upfront representation in the first film was probably a nod to the star power of Gene Wilder, who, for many, remains the bar one must hurdle to play the role. Johnny Depp's famously creepy performance seems to have split audiences but might actually have gotten closer in spirit to Dahl's conception of the character. (In fact, Dahl was said to have hated the Wilder version.) And Timothée Chalamet's singing and dancing turn was called "infinitely charming" by reviewers, perhaps relieved that the film wrestled the franchise out of some dark corners.

Speaking of singing and dancing, the 2004 stage musical on offer tonight was the brainchild of Leslie Bricusse and Anthony Newley (Stop the World, I Want to Get Off) who wanted to include songs from the 1971 Wilder version, while contributing some new songs done in what they considered "a retro style" that would work thematically with the originals.

By this time, Dahl had passed away, which left his, by all accounts, formidable widow Felicity to be the gatekeeper of any future representations of her husband's work. Tim McDonald, co-author of the book for the musical pitched his idea to her, saying: 'It's about a kid who breaks the rules, admits it, and because of that, he wins everything." This, apparently, won her over. McDonald thought about that pitch after the show opened: "Charlie does wrong; he breaks the rules," he said. "But he goes to Wonka, and he admits it. That's why he wins: he made a mistake, but he was smart enough to admit it. We all do things that are wrong, but to admit it, ask for forgiveness, and be given forgiveness is a beautiful lesson for all humans, and for young people."

Or you can always just club them over the head with a frozen leg of lamb.


Vera Riray (Candy Man Kids & Oompa-Loompa Kids Chorus , Squirrel)
